### Electing Philanthropy

Each year, many very personal votes are cast when generous people elect philanthropy, deciding to leave permanent charitable legacies in their communities. They are responding to many of the same ideals to which public office candidates appeal:

- Our net total investment return for 2007 was 7.7% and total assets grew to \$174,259,528.
- Our combined administrative and investment costs were 1.00% of total average assets last year.

"I have lived in Stark County my whole life. I was born here and I still live here now, even though I work in Akron. I think I first heard about Stark Community Foundation through a Leadership Stark County program day – that day was on community trusteeship. We learned about all the different foundations in the city. We knew about most of them, but Stark Community Foundation really was a unique concept. It was individuals like me creating their own fund to fill community needs that they wanted to fulfill in the community.

"A few years ago, I hadn't named beneficiaries for my 401K and my life insurance and I looked at the form and I thought my life savings could make an impact on the community after I'm gone – and, I remembered the Stark Community Foundation, so I called them and I had this idea to start a fund for the Canton City Schools.

"It's really easy to work with Stark Community Foundation. They make sure that what you want to do with your funds is accomplished. They make the fund flexible enough so that in the future it can meet the changing needs of the community.

The Foundation sends us notifications when others donate to our Fund. They communicate with the organizations to which we give. The Foundation staff is very pleasant and easy to work with and is very responsive to our needs."

"We feel it's important to give back to the community because we live here, work here, and our children are growing up here. We want to involve our children in the process so as they get older they can help us make decisions and help to make our community a better place."

When you walk in the door, that secretary is a friend of ours and when you go into the office everyone says Hi, how are you today?, so people are real important at the Foundation. It's important to give back to the community because the community is what gave you your start in life."

## Easy to Give Back Bill and Candy Wallace

Bill is a radiologist at Aultman Hospital and Candy was a stay-at-home mom and is a community volunteer. They moved to Plain Township 28 years ago from Cleveland.

Candy first heard about Stark Community Foundation through her involvement in various community organizations and knew she wanted to learn more.

**CANDY** "I kept hearing about Stark Community Foundation and the good work they did.

"Once we decided to open a fund, the process couldn't have been easier. Sometimes it's intimidating to think about going to fill out any kind of tax forms or any legal documents. The Foundation handles all of that information for you. They send out quarterly reports about how your donation to the Foundation has grown. It's just a very easy process, something that you don't have to worry about. You just think about the good that your money is doing."

**BILL** "After my mother passed away we seriously thought about starting a fund, so we talked to the Foundation about the possibilities and found that we could open a fund in memory of my parents.

"The Foundation walks you through everything. It makes it very easy to be a benefactor.

"They have a group of professional and volunteer leaders who know what's going on in the community. They know how to best invest the money to make our donation grow even more. Our funds will benefit Stark County organizations forever, as well as being a tribute to our parents.

"I think that when you get something it's only fair to return something. Part of being an adult is that you don't just take, you give back. We've gotten a lot from Stark County...from Plain Township, basically our whole adult lives. Our kids were raised here, and so I think it's only fair for me, who has benefited from this community, to give back to the community."

## A Legacy for Stark County Jim and Shirley Green

A retired engineer, Jim Green has lived in Stark County for more than 70 years, most of those with his wife Shirley, a retired junior accountant. He was able to make a better life for himself after a stroke of good fortune and now uses the Stark Community Foundation to help create good fortune for others.

"After high school, a college education did not seem to be a possibility in our future due to the lack of financial aid. After serving with the United States Marines; however, the GI Bill made it possible for me to obtain a college degree.

"We have had a desire from our early years to give back and help young students fulfill their goals if we were ever in a position to do so.

"This is why we had a strong desire to leave a legacy of helping others in Stark County. In the year 2000 we started a scholarship fund with Stark Community Foundation. We were able to build a legacy in the community with a smaller amount of funds than what I thought was required. Since then we have given more than 30 scholarships to graduates of our alma mater, Canton South High School.

"Shirley and I chose Stark Community Foundation because they serve Stark County by helping others, and helping others is what we like to do. We feel it is important to give back to the community where we have lived, worked, and now spend our retirement years."

## Making Stark County a Better Place Tom Schauer

Tom Schauer is a long-time resident of Stark County. He grew up on 7th Street in Canton and except for when he was in the military and away at college, he has lived in Stark County all of his life. Tom found that through Stark Community Foundation he was able to give back to the community that has given much to him.

“What led me to the Stark Community Foundation was a retiring trust officer at one of the banks. He told me that two local families put in seed money to start a charitable fund that would allow anyone to leave a legacy that would benefit our community forever.

“That fund became Stark Community Foundation. It’s a means through which current, active citizens contribute to a central endowment that distributes funds within the community. These funds go to a favorite local charity you want to fund after you’re gone, or into a general fund where a committee decides what organizations need funding.

“The fact that my earnings during my career all came from working with people in Stark County, I can’t think of any better way to distribute anything that I’ve accumulated than to give it back to the community, right where it came from.”

Besides being a contributor, Schauer was also a volunteer on Stark Community Foundation’s distribution committee, where he saw first-hand how carefully earnings on contributions are distributed to charitable organizations.

“If you have enjoyed living in Stark County, have benefited from employment here and feel it would be good to perpetuate your interests here, there’s no better way to do it than to have the help of a professional staff like the one at Stark Community Foundation.”

## Community Service David and Theresa Roshong

In the summer of 1996, David and Theresa Roshong received the call that no parent ever wants to get. They were notified that their son Brian, a newly hired Canton Police Officer, had been shot. Brian died from the wounds.

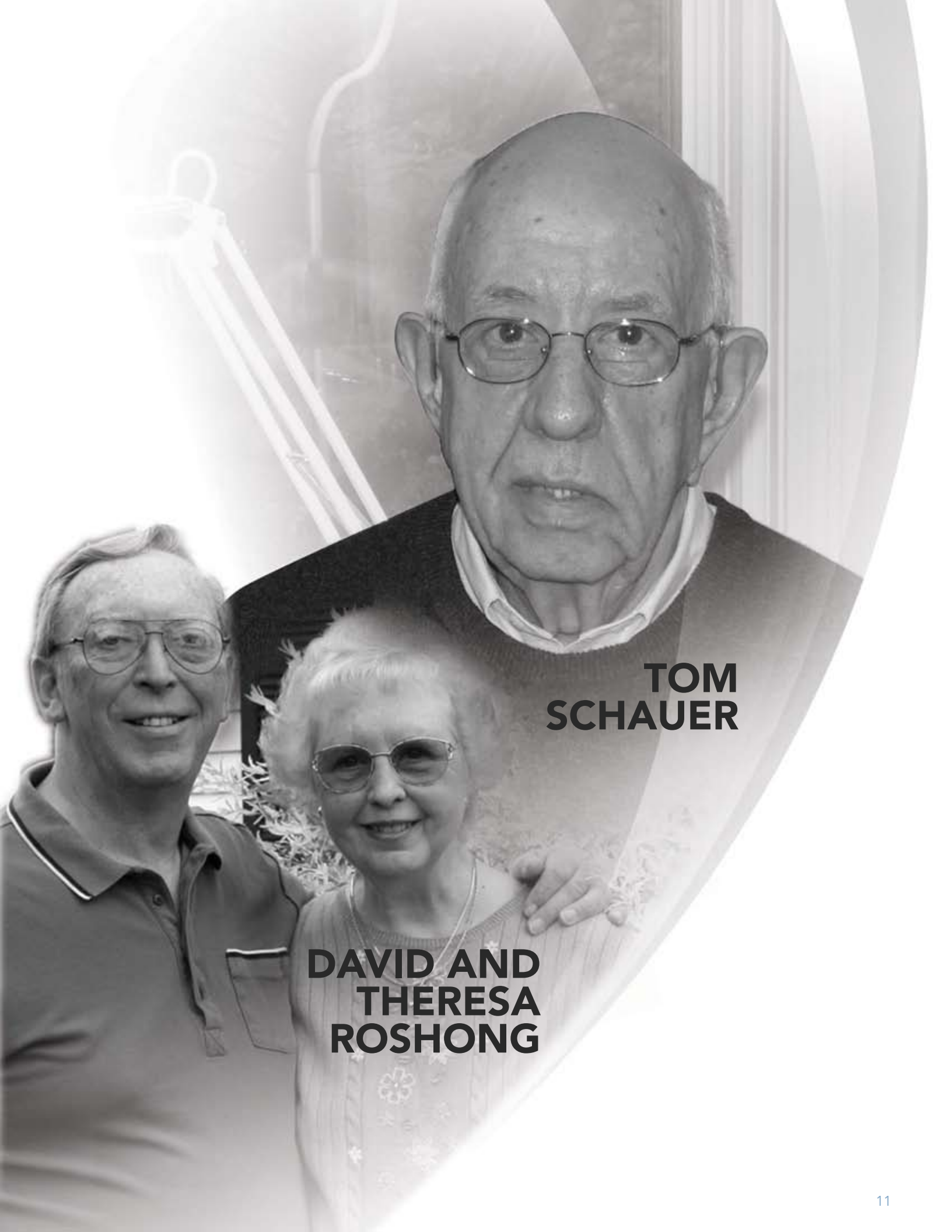
**THERESA** “We had a lot of people coming forward, bringing us donations. They (the community) wanted to do something and we felt that we wanted their donations to go to some worthy cause. We contacted the Foundation and asked them to help us set up a memorial fund for Brian.”

**DAVID** “We heard great things about the Foundation. We knew the Foundation had ties within our community. We thought that working with the Foundation would be the right route to go. This is something we needed help with. We thought their expertise would allow us to do it in the proper manner.

“We’ve always had a lifestyle in regards to helping in the community. Our children were also raised that way. In community service, part of my job as a Captain with the Sheriff’s office was helping people and giving; and Theresa, as a nurse, certainly gave much of herself.

“We wanted to set up a fund, and we call it the Brian C. Roshong Memorial Fund. We decided the fund would be used to help newly hired officers of the Canton Police department purchase uniforms and special equipment necessary to get them started in their career.”

**THERESA** “Certainly it is nice to receive a gift, but it is also much more meaningful to give than to receive. This is why the Memorial Fund was established and works so well.”

## Board of Directors and Distribution Committee



Stark Community Foundation is governed by the Board of Directors (corporate form) and the Distribution Committee (trust form). Nine members constitute these congruent governing bodies. Five separate community entities appoint the members: two by the Trustees Committee made up of the Presidents of the Trustee Banks; four by Stark Community Foundation, Inc.; one by the Stark County Courts of Common Pleas Judges; one by the Stark County Probate Court Judge; and one by the United Way of Greater Stark County Board of Trustees. Members serve as volunteers and are appointed for a five-year term. They are eligible for one successive five-year term if re-appointed.

## The Canton Garden Center Children's Garden Education Fund

The Children's Garden Education Fund was established to provide funding for educational programs for pre-school and primary elementary children from all socio-economic backgrounds. Programs are conducted in the Children's Garden at the Canton Garden Center located at 1615 Stadium Park N.W., Canton, Ohio. The Children's Garden Committee's goal is that children attending the "Pergola Parties for Kids" educational programs will gain understanding about nature, the importance of caring for our environment and the interrelatedness of plants that grow and foods we eat. The interpretative and interactive programs are free to all children. All programs are provided by Children's Garden Committee volunteers.



## The Lola Coleman-Ralston Family Memorial Scholarship Fund

This Fund has been established by several generations of the Ralston family to honor the memory of Lola Coleman-Ralston. Lola graduated from Scio Normal School in 1903 at the age of 16. She became a teacher and taught at the Carroll County #8 School, just north of Mechanicstown. Eventually she married and raised 12 children, who attended Carrollton High School between 1926 and 1949, many of them earning academic honors. Although education was an important value in the family, financial difficulties prevented Lola's children from moving on to college.

In Lola's memory, the Ralston family wishes to assist deserving Carrollton High School students in obtaining a college education. Candidates will be Carrollton High School students who demonstrate academic merit and financial need. Other considerations will be personal integrity, a desire and determination to succeed, participation in extra-curricular/civic activities, and an interest in the community. Priority will be given to residents of Fox and East Townships.



## The Crossroads Conservation Fund

The Crossroads Conservation Fund has been established to improve the environment and economy in our region. This fund will help the Crossroads Resource Conservation and Development Council Inc. (Crossroads RC&D) in partnering with private and public sector organizations in developing local programs and projects that benefit our region. Past accomplishments of the organization include: improved water quality, restored habitats, new jobs and businesses, and provided communities an opportunity to improve local facilities. The Fund was established to perpetuate our support for no-kill animal protection organizations and other non-profit organizations in Stark County.

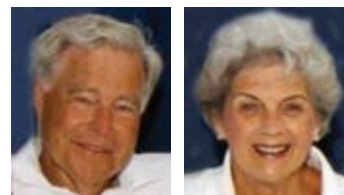

**The Lake Dollars For Scholars Endowment Fund**

The Lake Dollars For Scholars Endowment Fund was established in 2007 by Lake Dollars For Scholars - an organization started by Lake Academic Booster club volunteers in 1991. Lake Dollars For Scholars is affiliated with ScholarshipAmerica® - a national network of more than 1,200 grassroots, community-based, volunteer-driven scholarship foundations located throughout the United States. Dollars For Scholars began in 1958 with an idea from Dr. Irving Fradkin, an Optometrist in Fall River, Mass., that if everyone in the community gave just a dollar to an educational fund, it would be enough to help nearly

every student in the community who wanted to attend college. From 1992 to 2007, Lake Dollars For Scholars awarded 545 scholarships totaling \$335,700 to graduating high school seniors residing in the Lake Local School District. Students are selected for academics, activities and financial need, based on guidelines established by ScholarshipAmerica. The endowment fund was established and added in 2007 with earmarked donations of more than \$25,000 to insure that scholarships would continue to be awarded in future years. Lake Dollars For Scholars continues to raise money for scholarships as well as accepting donations of cash and stock to the Lake Dollars For Scholars Endowment Fund.

The Sorensons established this fund to grant, during their lifetimes, assets to a variety of recipients of their choice and, upon their deaths, the

remaining equity to 14 specific institutions previously identified by them.

Friends of Stark Parks was created in 1997 for the purpose of promoting the use and facilitating growth and conservation of the parks which comprise the Stark County Park District. Contributions of cash and/or property to the Stark

County Park District Endowment Fund (SCPDEF) will be used to further this purpose for the benefit of residents of Stark County.

# Affiliate Organization

## The Carroll County Foundation

Established 1994

The Carroll County Foundation was created through an agreement with Stark Community Foundation.

The Carroll County Foundation exists “to promote and facilitate charitable and philanthropic giving for the benefit of the Carroll County community.” The Carroll County Foundation has a nine-member Board of Governors, six of whom are appointed by Carroll County organizations and three of whom are selected as at-large members by majority vote of the other members. The six organizations that appoint one member each include: The Carroll County Bar Association, The Carroll County Chamber of Commerce, The Carroll County Commissioners, The Carroll County Farm Bureau, The Carroll County Ministerial Association and The Carroll County Retired Teachers’ Association.

# Supporting Organizations

## The William and Minnette Goldsmith Foundation

Established 1999

Previously a private foundation, The William and Minnette Goldsmith Foundation became a supporting organization of Stark Community Foundation in 1999. The original charitable foundation was established by bequest of Minnette Goldsmith who died in 1979. William Goldsmith, who died in 1961, was an engineer and had been Executive Vice President of The Luntz Corporation. Friends and family remember the Goldsmiths as being very generous philanthropists during their lives.

## The Henry and Louise Timken Foundation

Established 1980

The Henry and Louise Timken Foundation is a 509 (a) (3) supporting organization of Stark Community Foundation. Formerly a private foundation, The Henry and Louise Timken Foundation became a supporting organization on July 15, 1980. The Henry and Louise Timken Foundation is a charitable corporation governed by a Board of Trustees of seven members, three of whom are individuals representing the donors’ family and four of whom are appointed by Stark Community Foundation. The Board of Trustees awards charitable grants primarily for the benefit of the Stark County community and programs outside this area that are of special interest to the Trustees. The Henry and Louise Timken Foundation has been particularly important to Downtown Canton redevelopment efforts.

## The United Way Foundation

Established 1996

The United Way Foundation is a supporting organization of both Stark Community Foundation and United Way of Greater Stark County. Its permanent assets include bequests made to United Way over the years and will include future contributions that provide endowment income to add to current United Way campaign contributions. The United Way Foundation will enhance and strengthen funding for the many United Way human service and recreation organizations through the coming years.

# Grantseekers Guidelines

## ELIGIBILITY

Grants are made to: tax-exempt private agencies, 501 © (3) organizations which are public charities, and government entities located within Stark County, Ohio only or directly benefiting Stark County. The Foundation does not award grants to individuals except through scholarship funds.

## GUIDELINES

Generally the Foundation awards charitable grants to help launch new programs, initiatives, or capital needs not addressed by existing organizations. The Foundation requires year-end evaluative reports for all charitable grants, and collects specific data to track outcomes of our Board directed Impact Areas: Afterschool, Affordable Housing and Economic Development, and Neighborhood Capacity Building. In order to make the best use of available funds, Stark Community Foundation (SCF) looks for one or more of the following conditions when reviewing proposal requests:

- Emphasis on sustainability - We encourage organizations to present an outline of their long-range plans, building sustainability into their program’s initial design.
- Entrepreneurial ideas - We believe that social innovation should arise from a healthy milieu of community life from people closest to the problem (grass-roots).
- Best practices of social change in our community - We use new knowledge to inform policy makers and to help public officials have a clearer understanding of what approaches have been most efficient & effective.
- Capacity building, personal and team growth within non-profit organizations - This includes technical assistance in areas such as management, human resources, fundraising, finance and board development to help ensure long-term growth.
- Organizational ability to leverage ideas and resources - We realize partnerships achieve more together around a common cause and eliminate duplication of services.

## POLICIES

Stark Community Foundation normally does not approve grants to support:

- operating expenses of well-established organizations;
- deficit financing for programs or capital expenditures;
- endowment funds;
- religious organizations for religious purposes;
- annual appeals and membership contributions;
- conferences and recognition events.

## HOW TO APPLY FOR A GRANT

### I. PROGRAM GRANT PROPOSAL CHECKLIST

- Cover letter signed by the Board President and the executive director stating the purpose, the amount of the request, and board endorsement of the request;
- Introduction to your organization (short history), your mission and a short overview of current programs and activities;
- Summary of the project/program, including problem or need statement plus program goals, objectives, and strategies for implementation. Optional: brief discussion of alternative approaches considered;
- Appropriate plan for evaluation procedures, criteria and outcomes collected;
- Complete Proposed Project Budget Worksheet which includes a documented line-item expense budget, and revenue budget, showing all projected sources of funds for the proposed grant request (available through the Foundation or download from our website);
- List other foundations or funding sources contacted for the project;
- Long range sustainability plans for continuing the program or project once Foundation funding ends.

#### **Additional Required Material** (one copy of each required)

- Determination Letter from IRS confirming the organization's tax-exempt status: 501(c)(3);
- Board of Directors list, including the primary professional/civic affiliation of each member;
- Copy of your latest audited financial statement or copy of your latest 990;
- Endorsement letters should be sent directly to Stark Community Foundation.

- List Funding requested from public appeals, state, local, federal funding or other diverse funding;

- Complete Proposed Project Budget Worksheet which includes a documented line-item expense budget, and revenue budget, showing all projected sources of funds for the proposed grant request (available through the Foundation or download from our website);
- List of other foundations to which you have submitted this proposal and status of request;
- Impact that capital project will have on the current operating budget;
- Income and expense statement for your current fiscal year budget;
- Copies of three estimates received from different businesses to complete your capital purchase/project.

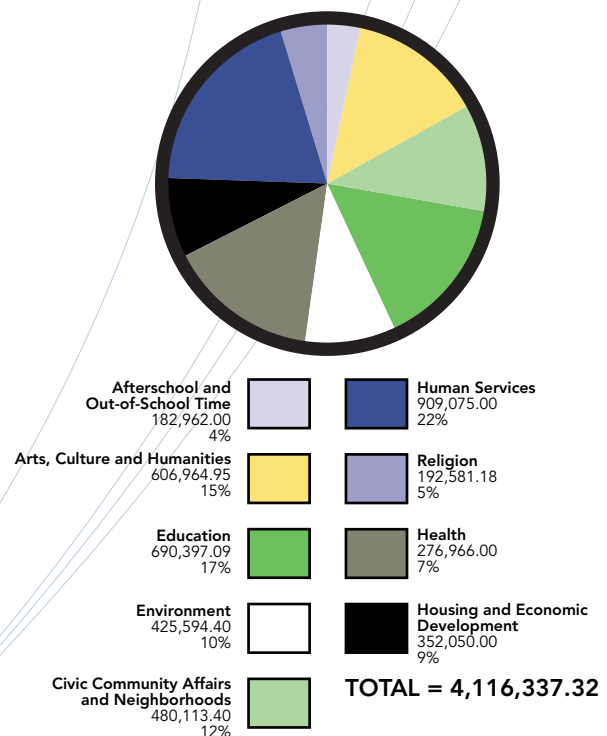
