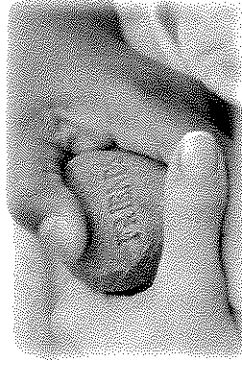

Neighborhood Leadership Training Sessions

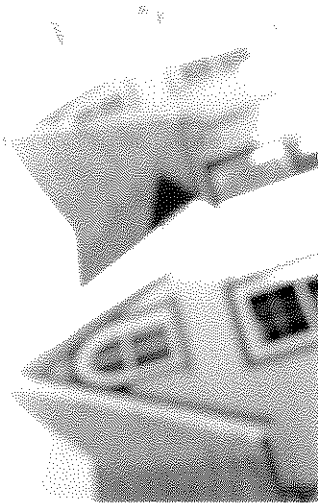
From the History of Neighborhoods, to Conflict Resolution, to Neighborhood Goal Setting, the classroom sessions will offer you knowledge about issues and resources that affect your neighborhood. Additional leadership skills and new contacts will assist you in furthering your neighborhood and personal goals. You will also receive a certificate honoring your completion of the program.

Upon graduation, you will become a part of the growing network of neighborhood leaders, the Neighborhood Leadership Council, which meets on a monthly basis to exchange information about their neighborhood activities, exchange ideas and network. The Neighborhood Leadership Council meetings are held at Stark Community Foundation. More information about the Neighborhood Leadership Council will be given at the training graduation.



Program Objectives

- to build upon the neighborhood leader's experience
- to encourage and assist in the establishment of network among neighborhoods, their leaders and their institutions
- to broaden the participant's understanding of the community at large
- to enhance the ability of neighborhood residents to resolve problems on their own or in cooperation with other neighborhood groups and institutions



Why Neighborhood Leadership Training?

Who cares more about the future of your neighborhood than its residents? Every day many actions are taken and decisions made that affect your neighborhood and your city. Some things change because of your efforts in your neighborhood. However, sometimes decisions that may have the greatest impact on your neighborhood's future do not include your input. The Neighborhood Leadership Training program is designed to increase the participation and effectiveness of neighborhood residents in deciding on the future of their neighborhood and their city. Emphasis is placed on capacity building and the identification of neighborhood assets.

- a recognition of your role as a neighborhood leader
- a unique opportunity to learn, to participate, to contribute
- an opportunity to solve today's problems and build tomorrow's dreams
- a way to bring hope for the future of your neighborhood
- an opportunity to advocate for and to support continued positive change in your neighborhood
- a vehicle to develop a committed, core group of individuals who are active in the life of their neighborhood and in community affairs
