## Prepared for Health Foundation of Greater Massillon

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Most data in the fact sheets was compiled from the U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey 5-year estimates covering 2016-2020. This is the most reliable and consistent source of data on community conditions for small geographies. Although most communities within the region covered by the Health Foundation of Greater Massillon are included, data for some was not available or was severely limited.

All the data in the fact sheets carry margins of error which can be substantial. While these are the best estimates available, differences between communities should be interpreted with caution.

Additional information about select indicators is included below.

**Race and Ethnicity:** The U.S. Census Bureau classifies Hispanic/Latino as an ethnicity, and people who are Hispanic/Latino can be of any race (white, Black, Asian, etc.)

**Median Household Income** represents the 50<sup>th</sup> percentile of household income in a community. Half of the households have incomes below the median income and half are above.

**Labor Force Participation Rate** counts the adults ages 16 and older who are either working (Employed) or actively looking for work (Unemployed)

**Poverty** thresholds are defined by the federal government. For the purposes of U.S. Census data, the poverty thresholds vary based on family size and age of householder. If a household's total pre-tax income before transfers is less than the poverty threshold, every member of the family is considered to be living in poverty.

**Public Benefits Income** included in U.S. Census Bureau is self-reported and may not align with caseload size reported by government agencies such as the Department of Job and Family Services.

**Education** data shows the highest degree obtained by the adult population ages 25 and older.

**Housing Unit built before 1970** is included because it indicates the number of homes in a community which might contain lead paint. Lead in paint was banned in 1978.

**Household has an internet subscription** includes both home-based internet connections and subscriptions to connect to the internet through a smartphone.

**Health Coverage** data is from the U.S. Census Bureau while other health indicators were compiled by ZIP Code from the CDC PLACES project.
