From the History of Neighborhoods, to Conflict Resolution, to Neighborhood Goal Setting, the classroom sessions will offer you knowledge about issues and resources that affect your neighborhood. Additional leadership skills and new contacts will assist you in furthering your neighborhood and personal goals. You will also receive a certificate honoring your completion of the program.

Upon graduation, you will become a part of the growing network of neighborhood leaders, the Neighborhood Leadership Council, which meets on a monthly basis to exchange information about their neighborhood activities, exchange ideas and network. The Neighborhood Leadership Council meetings are held at Stark Community Foundation. More information about the Neighborhood Leadership Council will be given at the training graduation.



Program Objectives

- to build upon the neighborhood leader's experience
- to encourage and assist in the establishment of networks among neighborhoods, their leaders and their institutions
- to broaden the participant's understanding of the community at large
- to enhance the ability of neighborhood residents to resolve problems on their own or in cooperation with other neighborhood groups and institutions

Emphasis is placed on capacity building and the identification of neighborhood assets.
